Executive Director's Comments

One of the great blessings of the work I am privileged to do is seeing the children who lived here when they come back to visit as adults. Right after Christmas I had a visit with Josh, one of the first boys that came to the Children's Home right after I started here as Executive Director 23 years ago. I have a lot of memories of Josh, many of which are associated with Josh's participation in George Wythe's JROTC program. I remember going to football games and watching Josh as a leader of the color guard performing during the National Anthem. Josh took a lot of pride in being a JROTC member. and he carried that into his adult life as a member of our Armed Forces. Josh served in Afghanistan, where he received injuries that have limited his mobility. Josh has stayed in touch with us, and it was great to see him in person.

During our conversation Josh told me that he knew his life would have taken a very different turn if not for the two years he spent with us. He recalled the staff members that worked with him and the difference they made in his life. Josh has moved back to the area with his wife and child, and what stood out to me was his obvious love for his child and the joy he takes in being a father. It is a wonderful experience when our children come back as adults and they are successfully raising their children. It tells us that the work we do in breaking the cycle of abuse and neglect that so many of our children experience has taken root.

My visit with Josh was inspiring, but it is also humbling to know that God has granted us the power to change children's lives through our ministry. The Children's Home is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year. We are always there to provide a home for children in what is probably the lowest point in their young lives. Josh is one of over 900 children that have lived here since 2000. There are many organizations

doing great work, but very few are able to bring children into a loving home situation at moment's notice. It has been our mission for over 100 years, and with your help our doors will remain open for some of God's most needy children.
