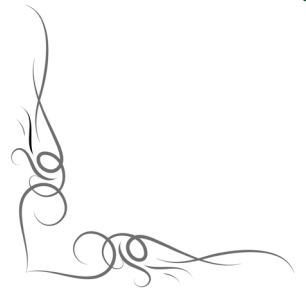

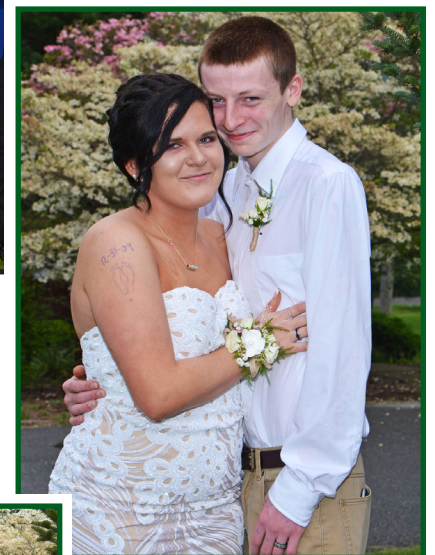

At about 1:00 PM on February 1st, life changed at the Children's Home. That is when we found out that Travis Wirt, our Program Director and friend, passed away from a heart attack at the tender age of 34. A man who deeply loved his job and the children we serve was gone in the blink of an eye.

Travis was a man of faith that was loved by his family, his co-workers, and his large circle of friends. He had a special place in his heart for our children, who would flock to his office to see "Mr. Travis". Before he was promoted to Program Director, Travis served as a Houseparent and our Development Officer. He had a wonderful relationship with so many of our supporters that continued after his promotion.

Many of you have reached out to support us in our time of grief, and we are grateful beyond words to each and every one of you. We are carrying on, because we know that Travis would not have it any other way. We will honor his legacy through the work we do with our children, and take comfort that he has taken his rightful place with our Heavenly Father.

I want to close with a quote we borrowed from Rita F. Pierson that we used during the celebration of Travis' life that we held in our chapel on February 9th. *"Every child deserves a champion, an adult who will never give up on them, who understands the power of connection and insists that they become the best that they possibly can be"*.
