As you read this, our children will have been in school for about a month. Many of our students are behind academically when they come to us, and those who have joined us over the summer will have to adjust to being in a new school. We take a great deal of pride in giving our children the best possible opportunity for academic success. It begins with making sure they are in the right academic situation, whether it be in public schools, specialized education at the Minnick Education Center, a GED program, or Wytheville Community College for our Independent Living residents. Many of you have helped us make sure that our children have the school supplies they need, as well as new clothes that make them feel comfortable among their peers. Our children's academic deficits are usually not about ability. It comes from dealing with dysfunctional family situations that cause education to be a very low priority in their lives.

We have found that while we can give our children all the material advantages that I mentioned above, the greatest obstacle we have to overcome is getting our children to understand the need for structure in their lives and to accept that we love them enough to put that structure in place. Most of us have not experienced a childhood where we were left to our own devices due to parental substance abuse, fear of physical

violence, lack of food, or just plain neglect. If you are a child who has experienced very little adult guidance in your life, a loving structure will seem strange to you. Many of them rebel against it, but most come to realize they need to structure their lives not only for academic success, but also as a guide for a productive life in the future.

Our cover story about Garrett highlights one of the many achievements of our residents. When you see these accomplishments in our newsletters, please know that you are part of their success. Our mission, "giving children hope and purpose for the future", is unattainable without your love and support. Thank you and God bless!
